Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes, Inc., began in 1891, when Mrs. Georgia Eastman and a committee of ladies began a Christian home for orphans in the former Hotel Delaware in West Nashville. Since its beginnings, TBCH has grown and adapted to meet the needs of children across the state. In 2015 TBCH began The George Shinn Foster Care Program, which now serves all three regions of Tennessee.

Our Program

TBCH has a contract with Tennessee Department of Children's Services to provide certified foster families for children who are in the custody of the state.



TBCH is donor-supported and does not charge any fees to our foster parents. Our program includes training, support, direction and advocacy for these children and foster families by our qualified and dedicated Foster Care Case Managers.

Our Foster Parents

Becoming a foster parent takes compassion and commitment. We carefully select evangelical Christians who are active in a local church to serve as foster parents, so children placed in their homes are cared for physically as well as spiritually. We believe the most crucial thing we can share with a child is the love and hope of Christ.





Case managers work with our foster parents from the first steps of the application process through and beyond the placement of a child or sibling group in their homes. Occasionally long-term foster placements lead to adoptions, which TBCH case managers are also equipped to oversee.
