
### A Traditional Dish...



#### Teamwork Makes the Dream Work

Our Foster Care staff in East Tennessee came together earlier this spring for a quarterly team day, including a self-defense training session, and time to volunteer at Compassion Closet in Knoxville.

They also attended the TBRI Summit in Chattanooga sponsored by Empowered to Connect. TBRI, or Trust-Based Relational Intervention, is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children. Our direct care workers are trained in TBRI, and some are certified TBRI Practioners.

# A DIFFERENT SORT OF ADOPTION

If there was ever a doubt that foster parents are heroes, you'll have a hard time finding any better evidence than the following, shared by a TBCH Foster Care Case Manager recently (faces covered and names omitted for privacy).

One of our foster families is a single mom who has been fostering for about ten years. She has adopted three children out of foster care and is committed to meeting the needs of as many children as she can while she has the ability to do so. Last year, she jumped in again and took in a sibling group of three.

They quickly adapted into her family, but still grieved the life they used to have, as many foster kids do. Over the last year or so, the foster mom has done her best to keep the children connected with their birth family—through weekly video calls and occasional in-person visits. One day, when the oldest of the siblings was on the phone with his Peepaw, he learned that his childhood dog had been taken to the Humane Society. He was devastated, as this dog had been with him and his sisters through most of their childhood.



Unbeknownst to him, his foster mom was at work behind the scenes, making a plan to pick up the dog after updating its vaccinations, and surprising the kiddos by adopting their beloved childhood pet. To say that the kids were excited is an understatement! Through the thoughtfulness and love of this foster mom, they were reunited with this four legged member of their family, putting a piece of their lives back in place.


